For 2017, MOFFA is working with individuals who are recognized experts and educators in one of three topic areas:


- Pest Management for Diversified Farms

Presentations on soil biology and fertility management, crop planning, scheduling and cultivar selection, strategies for attracting pollinators and beneficial insects, season extension and crop protection methods, water wise irrigation, and working with/teaching others, culminating with a round table open-ended conversation on our passion for gardens and farms.
